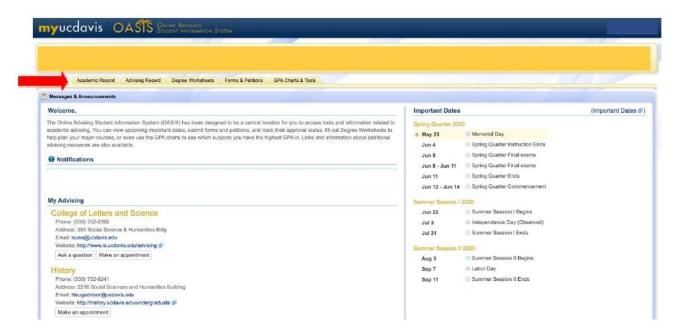


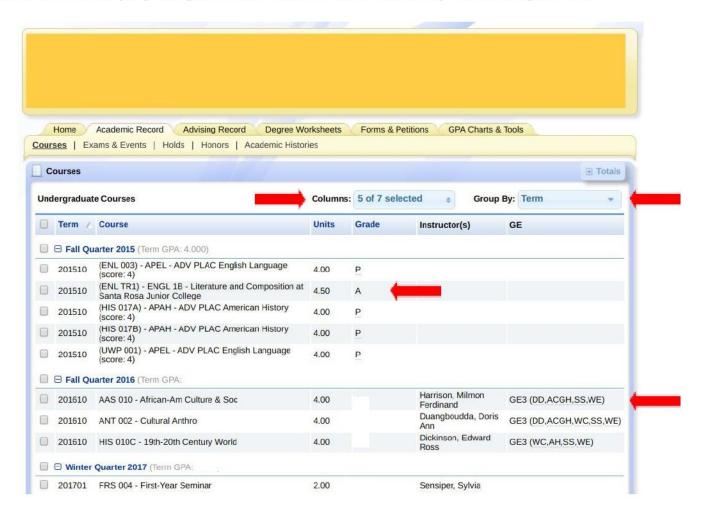
Academic Record in OASIS

The Academic Record tab on your OASIS account shows a list of the courses on your academic record. This includes classes that you've completed at UC Davis as well as courses that you have transferred into UC Davis from community college or through AP / IB tests. You can use this tab to keep track of your grades and the units you've completed. This tutorial will walk you through some of the features in this part of OASIS.

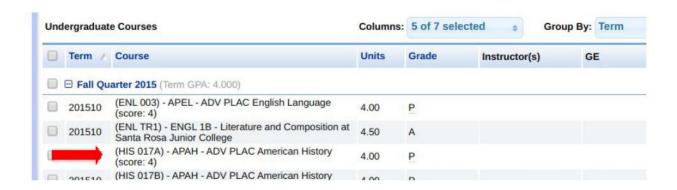
- 1) Log into your Oasis dashboard at <u>oasis.ucdavis.edu</u>.
- 2) Select the "Academic Record" tab.



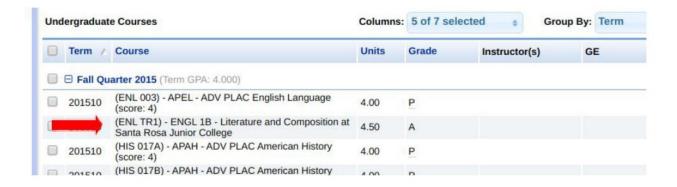
3) You can now see a list of classes that are being applied toward your UC Davis record. There are filters at the top that allow you to show additional information by adding more **columns** or sort by different categories **groups**. **Grades** are shown for classes that you've completed and **General Education (GE)** categories are shown for those that carry those designations.



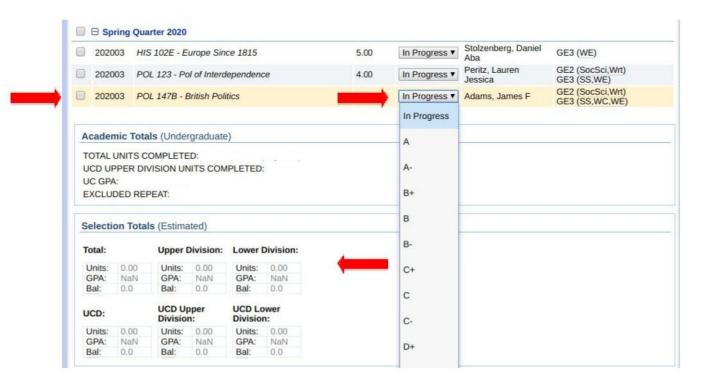
4) If you have transfer or AP/IB units, there will be a description of the credit and where it came from. In parentheses you will see how the units apply at UC Davis. If an exact course is listed (for example: HIS 17A) those units are considered to be the equivalent of our HIS 17A course at UC Davis. The course will meet the same requirements as HIS 17A from UC Davis. If you were to enroll in HIS 17A at UC Davis, it would be considered a repeated course and you may lose units from that transfer course.



5) If your transfer course does not show an exact class, but instead shows the course subject an 'TR' (for example: ENL TR1) that means that the course has not been approved as a direct equivalent of a UC Davis course. The course is still earning units that can count toward degree requirements but it may not be applying toward major requirements or GE requirements. If you would like the course reviewed for more specific credit, contact the department listed (for example: ENL = English) and ask about their transfer credit review process. Be prepared that you may need to provide a syllabus for the class that you wish to be reviewed.



6) Pending UC Davis classes will show an In Progress dropdown box in the Grade column. This can be used to calculate your potential GPA based on grades you enter. As you add your grades you will see your hypothetical GPA reflected in the "Academic Totals" section at the bottom of the page or the "Academic Totals" tab on the right hand of the screen. To only include certain classes, use the check box to the right of the course. If you would like a more robust GPA Calculator, see the GPA Charts and Tools tab at the top of the page.



This should help familiarize you with different features on the Academic Record tab of OASIS and help you keep track of your coursework throughout your time at UC Davis. If you are a new transfer student, it is a good idea to look over your record and make sure that you are not missing courses that you expected to receive credit for. If you are, contact an academic advisor or the Undergraduate Admissions office to see why it is missing and if there is additional paperwork that you need to submit.
